Children of Radley Staff Living on Site

November 2025

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Radley College is a **full boarding school**.

A small number of pupils who are children of members of staff live at home, on site, in Radley College accommodation.

In recognition of the fact that they have access to the full boarding offering of the school, that they live on site and are entitled to and receive the same levels of pastoral care and support as other pupils, they are listed as boarders on the admissions register.

This document outlines any particular considerations that are in place for these pupils and explores what it means to live at home within a boarding school.

Key Aims

Engagement: We want all pupils to fit in and make friends, and take full advantage of all the opportunities offered at Radley College.

Access: All pupils should be able to access all aspects of Radley life (other than regularly sleeping in Social).

Expectation: All pupils are expected to contribute fully to Radley life, be it academic, pastoral, co-curricular and spiritual in the same way as other students. Radley College is a full boarding school and this expectation extends to weekends.

Registration / Signing Out

We have a **safeguarding** obligation to know where pupils are.

Our official **registration** takes place in Socials. This includes all pupils and is an important contact point between the Social team and the pupil. The first point of registration is in the morning before period 1. The second point of registration is in the evening. Registration is conducted by the Tutor or delegated to another member of the Social Team. Registrations must be conducted in person.

The expectation is that all pupils will remain in school until at least **2100**.

The Tutor and Social team need to know whether the pupil is **on campus or off campus** at any given time. Socials therefore have robust systems for signing in / out. Pupils who live at home should always let the duty member of staff know when they go home at the end of the evening.

Commitments

All pupils, must attend **College commitments** such as **lessons, games, Chapel, Social Prayers and any other activities**.

All pupils attend **Chapel** on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Fridays and Sunday. Requests to miss a service for an exceptional out of College commitment are made through the Sub-Warden and Chaplain.

All pupils should attend all **meals** in Hall unless alternative arrangements are made with the Tutor.

The default expectation is that pupils who live at home complete **prep** in school.

All pupils are strongly encouraged to attend social events such as **Cocoa** to aid integration.

The full nature of a Radley day makes it difficult for pupils to join **external clubs and societies**. If a pupil who lives at home / parent wants the pupil to take part in an activity which clashes with a Radley commitment, then permission must be sought from the Tutor who will consult with relevant members of the College Management Team.

If a pupil **cycles** to school then they are reminded to read and follow the relevant section of the School Rules.

Privilege Weekends

The rules for taking Privilege Weekends are the same as they are for boarders. Pupils may take two Privilege Weekends per term, with discretion for 6.2 pupils. The weekend starts after the pupil has completed their College commitments on Saturday (including games practices / fixtures). When on a Privilege Weekend, pupils do not have to attend Sunday Chapel.

Facilities

Pupils who live at home will typically be provided with a room in Social with a **desk, a chair and a wardrobe**. It is usually the case that there is not a **bed** in their room. The College's **laundry** service is available to all pupils.

All pupils who are ill should go to the **Health Centre**. If illness occurs while the pupil is at home, parents should inform the Health Centre, Tutor and PHM. All pupils will be registered with the school doctor at Long Furlong Medical Practice.
